*In Reading this week, we learned about how to read a book on a CD at our Listening Center and read an E-book on the computer. We focused on the reading strategy called "Eagle Eyes". We learned to look at the pictures to help us figure out the tricky words in the books we read. We also shopped for *Just Right* books to put in our book bins. We learned how to use the Five Finger rule for finding a book that is *just right* for us.

*In Social Studies, we studied the Labor Day holiday and the type of work people do. Our class began interviewing some of Starling's workers. The students are learning about the different jobs that are done at our school. My son Carson was interviewed by our class this week and told about his job as a lifeguard at the University of Georgia. We are videotaping the interviews and will post them on our eCLASS page when all of our interviews are complete.

Math

- *count forward by ones, beginning from a given number within the known sequence (instead of having to begin at 1)
- *identify coins by name and value: pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, and dollar bills

Language Arts


- *Demonstrate understanding of spoken words, syllables, and sounds (phonemes)
- *Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to narrate a single event or several loosely linked events, tell about the events in the order in which they occurred, and provide a reaction to what happened.

Social Studies

*identify the purpose of Labor Day and describe the people and events celebrated.
